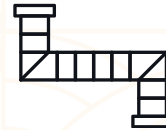

How it Works

- 2** **Schedule home audit:** RBG will help you schedule a home energy audit. This is a simple set of tests done to your home to decide which solutions are needed.
- 3** **Review Results:** RBG will explain the results of the tests, YOU decide which improvements you'd like to move forward with for your home.
- 4** **Upgrades begin:** You will assign an approved contractor to completed the upgrades.

Municipal energy customers are NOT eligible for NHSaves, but can potentially qualify for weatherization assistance through local CAP agencies.

Frequently Asked Questions

Are there income restrictions?

NHSaves has TWO programs. The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEA), which is based on your household income, and the Home Energy Performance Program (HEP) is based on your home's energy use.

HEA Income Eligibility Chart

Low-Income Eligibility

Adult Occupants	Max Gross Income
1	\$47,604
2	\$62,252
3	\$76,900

Moderate-Income Eligibility (Eversource Customers Only)

Adult Occupants	Max Gross Income
1	\$69,394
2	\$90,746
3	\$112,098

What do I need to show for income verification?

- 18-24 Month of your home's fuel usage documentation
- If you receive fuel assistance – please bring proof of your enrollment in this program
- Electric Utility Account Number
- Hot Water Type: Propane, Oil, Electric Other
- Photo ID and W2 or Paystub for proof of income or other proof of income or SSA document (if applicable)

How long does it take to complete upgrades?

The entire process (application, audit, and upgrades) takes anywhere from 3-6 months.

What is NHSaves?

NHSaves is a collaboration of New Hampshire's electric and natural gas utilities that provides residents incentives and rebates to save energy, and reduce utility costs

What is Resilient Building Groups (RBG)?

RBG is an approved contractor that specializes in home energy audits and improvements.

Where does the money come from?

Funding for the NHSaves program is collected through a "System Benefits Charge" (SBC) added to every electric and natural gas utility bill in the state, meaning every customer who pays an energy bill is contributing to the program.
